One day as Jesus was teaching,
Pharisees and teachers of the law were sitting there
who had come from every village of Galilee and Judea and
Jerusalem
and the power of the Lord was with Him for healing.
And some men brought on a stretcher a man who
was paralyzed; they were trying to bring him in and set him in
His presence.
But not finding a way to bring him in because of the crowds,
they went up on the roof and lowered him on the stretcher
through the tiles into the middle in front of Jesus.
When He saw their faith, He said, "As for you,
your sins are forgiven."

Luke 5:17-20

In a class I took recently at St. Bernard's, we were
asked to ponder how the visits we make to the sick or home-
bound or to those in nursing homes may differ from the visits
they receive from others; what makes our visits specifically
pastoral? I ask the same question of you who are reading this,
because I see one answer to this question in so many of you.
That answer is that we bring our faith to those visits; we are
bringing a tangible, visible gift of God's love, and we are doing
so intentionally. Our faith emanates from us saying, "God is
here."

The verses I quoted from the Gospel of Luke could be
thought about, studied and researched resulting in more infor-
mation and food for thought than I have room for in this article;
there is so much there. The line I want us to focus on is the last
one—"When He saw their faith, He said, 'As for you, your sins
are forgiven.'" Jesus saw the faith of the friends of the para-
lytic. Those friends, in their great faith, went to quite an ex-
treme to get their friend in front of Jesus. Then Jesus said, "As
for you, your sins are forgiven." He could have been referring
to the paralytic, his friends, or all of them. What does Jesus'
forgiving their sins have to do with healing the paralytic? Here
again we could get into some deep theology, but what occurs to
me is to ask, "What could be more healing than to be for-
given?"

I speak often about our being the Body of Christ. I see
this very literally. Christ was in the world incarnate for only a
few precious years. The Holy Spirit dwells in and among us
now, but we literally have to be the arms that reach out His love
to others; His mouth that speaks words of encouragement,
teaching, and care. When we take care of ourselves, we are
taking care of God's body. Taking care of ourselves includes,
most importantly, caring for our spiritual well-being. So here's
a plug for Care Notes: I have these booklets placed in racks in
the Baptistry area and the Parish Center lobby. They cover a
wide variety of topics, are simply but very well written, and
helpful. Please help yourselves.
