*Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for the temple of God, which you are, is holy.*

*1 Corinthians 3: 16-17*

We have talked before about our being the body of Christ, that with the benefit of the use of our voices, our arms, our hearts, our hands, God is made physically manifest to his children through us. It follows, then, that through others God is made manifest to us. This is another example of the circle of love that God has given us by his grace. In return, we have been given the responsibility to take as good care of God's dwelling - our bodies - as we possibly can.

This message comes to us from the secular world as well. There are diet books, advertisements for gyms, workout machines, diet pills, and diet meals. We hear it from our doctors as well. All of these sources have raised our consciousness about the importance of watching what we eat, exercising, not smoking, and generally taking care of our bodies. Less mentioned, but to my mind just as important, is taking care of our mental, emotional, and spiritual health. These are rooms in God's temple as well.

The words above from Corinthians sound severe. God obviously takes seriously the importance of taking care of his

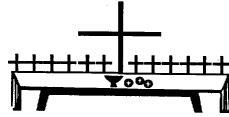
temple. These two verses can be taken another way - that God will deal severely with anyone who destroys the temple of God of another person. We read and hear about such incidents every day in the media. We as a society need to deal with this issue. But for today we will concentrate on our own responsibility for the health of our bodies.

There are many examples of medical situations that we really can't say (at least in as much as medical science is so far aware) are anyone's fault. People born with congenital anomalies, or who develop neurological or metabolic illnesses that are not a result of poor choices, are surely loved by God in a special way. And thanks be to God, we can always count on his help, his understanding, and his forgiveness for those of us who, let's admit it, don't always make the best choices where our health is concerned. What can we do? We can pray for God's help and his guidance, and then do the very best we can to make the right choices, and to educate ourselves as to what those choices should be.

So...I have invited a speaker from the Elizabeth Wende Breast Care group, to speak on bone health. She will be here on Thursday July 1, 2010 at 7pm in the Parish Center. Please join us! There is no charge for her talk, and I would like to make it worth her time to come to us. More importantly, this is a great opportunity for us to become educated on this very important aspect of women's and, yes, men's health. Hope to see you then.
