Father John Whelan was pastor and Father Bill Amann Assistant Pastor of 'Mercy' parish. I would stay overnight at the rectory there occasionally, especially during the winter. And it was rather like a quick trip to Florida. The rooms faced the enclosed atrium, complete with very tall trees and a running brook. Fathers Whelan and Amann were gracious hosts, and the pastor's sister, Lucy Whelan, cooked a mighty fine breakfast on Sunday mornings.

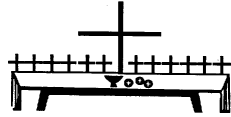
But most of all, I remember the parishioners, whose faith, hope and charity were a regular inspiration and support for us priests. But that was then, and now is now. Our Lady of Mercy is about to close. Some of the parishioners whose love and care I experienced have been enthusiastic supporters of the parish all along. No doubt, many more will attend the closing Mass there this weekend, Sunday June 27 at 2:00 PM. Certainly the story will not end there.

A Church is much more than a group of buildings. Conse-

quently, the life of prayer and service (the spiritual and corporal works of mercy) will continue. There will be a new story to tell. As far as I can predict, this new story will be best if it is told collegially, that is, as a group of believers who are greater than any one parish. All the faithful Catholics of East Greece/Charlotte can deepen and expand our life of prayer and service and be a beacon of light for the area.

Jesus' words to a disciple in today's Gospel reading are tough ones. But we could listen to them and be inspired: "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what is behind is fit for the kingdom of God". Please, Jesus, would you repeat that for us?
