Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light.

Matthew 11:28-30

July is a month for vacations. Why do we take vacations? That's pretty much a no-brainer - we all occasionally need a change of pace, a change of scene, and respite from the pressures of daily life. A recent bulletin touched on the importance of rest, that God created the world and rested on the seventh day. God understood the importance of reflecting on the beauty of his creation, and Jesus needed to get away by himself for prayer and time to be with his Father. The thing is: do we do it? Do we follow God's advice and Jesus' example? Sure, some people take vacations, and some people don't, for a variety of reasons. Perhaps finances make it difficult to get away (and honestly, how restoring can a "staycation" really be?) Illness or other responsibilities may prevent some from taking much needed time away. And what ever happened to stores being closed on Sundays, and those good old days when we looked upon Sunday as a day of rest? Many feel like they're wasting time if they are not busy doing something, or three things, every minute.

Truthfully, there is little we can do about most of the roadblocks to rest that I've mentioned. Our finances are what they are and most of us do the best we can to maximize that aspect of our lives. Illness and other heavy responsibilities are part of life. It's a big task to take on changing the social mores that have developed so subtly that we would have difficulty pinpointing when so many things changed. I do think that perhaps we could become less attached to our technological devices that make some people constantly available to that work issue or friend that cannot wait.

Is there an answer to this dilemma? Of course there is, and it is no further away than He who hears even our faintest whisper of a prayer. Read the above verses from the Gospel of Matthew slowly, contemplate the beauty and the peace, and the promise of rest that is there. Physical rest is an important part of our overall well-being, but much of our mental and emotional state has to do with our outlook, our attitude. This is where Christ comes in, and all that he promises when he says, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest."

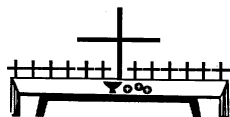
If you travel this summer, be safe; and may all of you find rest in Christ.

Cursillo

There is a movement that started in the early 40's in Spain called Cursillo, or it's full name, Cursillos de Cristiandad which means "short course in Christianity". This "short course" is meant to help Catholics develop a faith to readily fulfill our mission as Christians evangelizing in our world. The Rochester Diocese has had the benefit of this movement since the late 60's where many of our religious and lay people have been impacted to further fan the flames of the Holy Spirit inside of them.

The movement helps develop a close sense of community by sharing our thoughts and our own experiences to others so they can learn positive ways to impact their environments. It has been the catalyst needed to move many people into discernment for leadership vocations in the Church.

On July 23-26, there will be a 3-day experience at Notre Dame Retreat House where 36 women, 24 team members including two priests, a deacon and a Sister will put themselves in a cloistered environment to find an even deeper relationship with Christ. Mission Cooperation Plan

This weekend we welcome Reverend Peter Henry Fosu, a diocesan priest who comes to our church as a representative of the Archdiocese of Kumasi, Ghana, West Africa. Father Fosu was ordained on July 19, 1986 and expresses his gratitude to the church in America, which has contributed immensely to the growth of churches in Africa. He is quick to point out that he is one of the products of the missionary cooperation work of the Society of the Propagation of the Faith in the United States.

The Archdiocese of Kumasi has a population of about 605,000 with about half living in rural areas. They have 34 parishes, 158 mission stations, 70 priests, 66 Religious Sisters and Brothers and nearly 400 local Catechists serving the poor under harsh conditions.

Father Fosu thanks us all in anticipation of our much needed support for the priests, religious, and missionaries serving in the Archdiocese of Kumasi.
