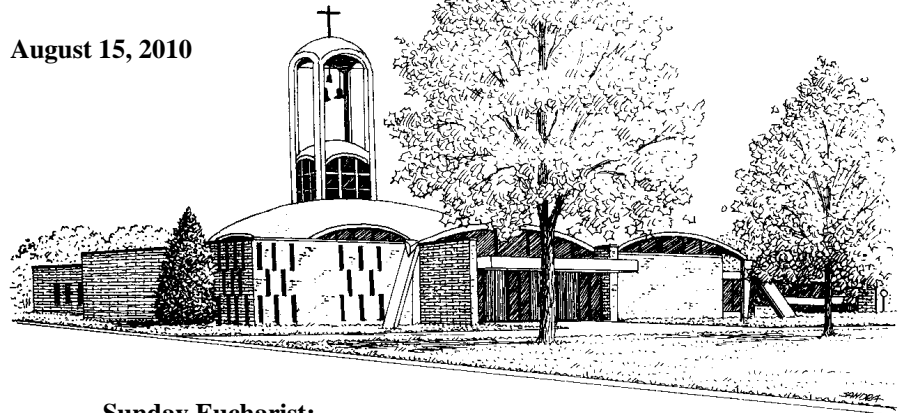

When you read this we will be in the middle of the dog days of summer. I hope you have had a good summer so far. I love this time of year and the long warm days. My family has climbed the mountains one more time this year with our annual vacation to Fourth Lake, the third week of July. I had the opportunity to catch up on some of my reading while on vacation and read a very interesting article in *U. S. Catholic Magazine* entitled: "It makes a difference whether you're Catholic." It is from a young woman who struggled with her faith as many young people do.

Here is some of what she said, "Being Catholic does matter. It matters tremendously. It matters because in a world of smoke and mirrors, of mirage and fraud, being Catholic means something genuine. In a world that encourages us to be the star of our own reality show, being Catholic urges us to take a supporting role in a much grander narrative, a much more vibrant drama. Being Catholic means that lots of strangers care about me. It means that in a world where marriages dissolve all the time, we have strangers rooting for us and telling us that our love for one another is a gift from God."

She goes on to say, "Being Catholic means that the

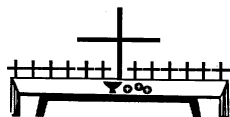
Our Father that was prayed at my baptism uses the same words that will bring me comfort when death's shadow enters my life. It means that the ancient book I wrestle with and find comfort in will be read by my children in their CCD classes. It means the words a woman named Julian put to paper in the 14th century are like music to my modern ears. Being Catholic means having something to offer those who suffer. It means that sadness and pain are not the only part of loss because God suffered a death on the cross and triumphed with life. Being Catholic means always having a home!"

She ends with these comments, "being Catholic matters the way that having a family matters. It means something was there before us, that something led to us and something will go beyond us. If we live it right the grandkids might even tell stories about us. It means that coming to the communion table is like coming to the dinner table, that sinking into the pew is like sinking into the sofa in grandma's basement. It may be musty but it is familiar and it is Home."

She gave us a lot to think about as the days of summer start to grow short. It does make a difference whether you are Catholic. Please give this article to anyone you know that may be struggling with their faith. Remember God loves you all and so do I.

2. **Mass Scheduling** is available for 2011. Please bear in mind when scheduling Masses so far in advance that changes may have to happen depending on the Pastor's schedule. That is why we might be asking for your phone number—so we can call you if that does happen.
3. **Ministry Schedule** for September-December will be done *this week*. Please call the office and let us know if you will be *unavailable* any weekends during that time period.
4. **Office Hours**—A reminder that the office is closed on Fridays/Saturdays. I will be taking some vacation time during August/September so it might be a good idea to call before coming to the office. When I am on vacation, your best time for someone being here is before noon.
