Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be.
John 14:1-3

I have recently been visiting a woman who has been told she has six months or less to live. This woman is truly remarkable, and the time I have spent with her has been an opportunity for spiritual growth for both of us. She has approached her cancer with intelligence, bravery, and faith. And in her humanity, the precious gift given to all of us by our Creator, she has also been faced with doubt, fear, and many questions. Does God really exist? Is heaven real? By our belief in God and in his promises, our answers to those questions are, of course, yes. The question we can't answer is, "What will it be like to actually experiencing God and heaven? What will it be like to die?" She has asked me these questions, and of course neither of us has any illusions that I know the answers. It helps to verbalize these thoughts, though, and her questions have been the stimulus for many conversations in which we have discovered new truths for us, or found a new way to look at an "old truth." And inevitably, there are always more questions.

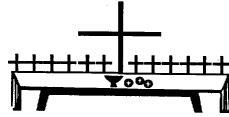
One day she asked me a question that I don't think I will ever forget. "What do you pack to take to heaven?" What does one pack in their spiritual suitcase? This is something that would likely be answered in as many different ways as there are people to answer. When do you start packing? Today might be a good answer to that; none of us know when our hour will come. Jesus reminds us on more than one occasion through his parables that it is best to be ready!

What will go into your spiritual suitcase? Will it be trust, doubt, hope, fear? We want to pack all the right things, but what exactly are those? I would like to pack a perfect faith, the knowledge that I have succeeded in living my life in complete compliance with God's rules, and I don't want to take with me doubt, or fear or regrets. However, the being the imperfect person that I am, I wonder what God will think of the contents of my suitcase. So I take courage in the following: "If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with you, so that you may be revered." (Psalm 130:3-4)

Fear is a normal part of experiencing something that we haven't done before, but so is hopeful anticipation. Whatever we pack into our suitcases, our Lord teaches us that we can do it with hope in his promises, and a sure knowledge of the love that will meet us when we reach our destination. So let's start thinking about what we want in our spiritual suitcase, start packing, and look forward to that day with hope and joy.
