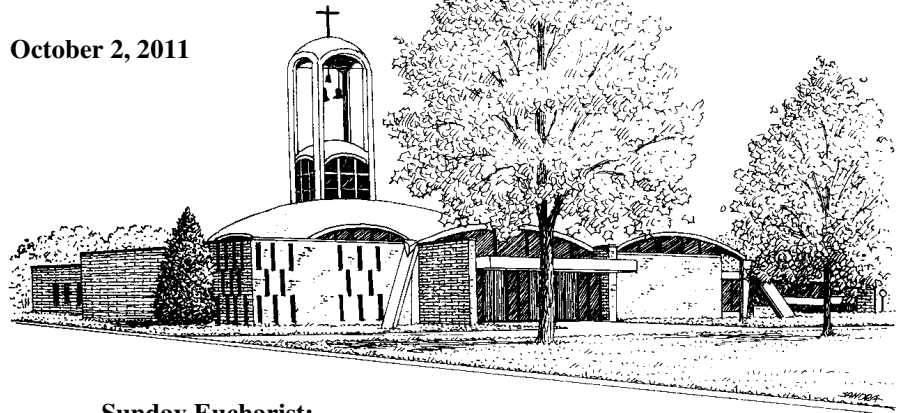

## Staff Time

This is a departure from my usual Staff Time format, but for an important reason. I want to make sure that you are all aware of the fact that we have some emergency equipment and supplies located in the Sacristy. As you enter the Sacristy from the church, through the double doors, you will see a white cabinet mounted on the wall directly to your right. This contains a first aid kit on the bottom shelf, and a defibrillator on the top shelf. They are both clearly marked. Also, there are extra first aid supplies in the cabinet to the left of the counter in the Sacristy. There is a first aid red cross on the door. Most likely you won't need to utilize those.

First of all, I want to emphasize that the first thing to do in case of an emergency is to call 911. Use your judgment - if someone has only a small cut, then 911 would not be necessary. If you're not sure if it's necessary or not, then CALL. Let the paramedics, who are trained to do so, make the assessment as to whether or not a person needs to go to the hospital.

The first aid kit is pretty straightforward. I would ask that if it is used please let me know so that I can re-supply it. (621-4040 x23) Having a first aid kit is not new, but now its location is easy to see.

The defibrillator is new to us, brought over from Our Lady of Mercy. It has a new battery and new pads and is

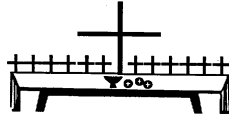
ready if needed. The use of this piece of equipment can be a little intimidating, but when one considers the alternative it is well worth it. Defibrillators have saved many lives, often by people as unfamiliar with its use as most of you are. Its official name is the "Lifepak 500" Automated External Defibrillator (AED). To open it, unbuckle the yellow straps on each side of the case. Inside you will find pockets that contain cards that tell you how to assess the victim, in large letters and simply written. Obviously, it is very important to not panic; maintain your composure. Start with the "CPR Reference" side of the card. Pull out everything in the pockets so you know what's there. When the machine is turned on you will hear a recorded message telling you step by step what to do. PLEASE NOTE: there is a small case attached to the strap of the defibrillator case. This contains the pads for use on a baby or child.

I would suggest that you take a moment someday soon to look in the Sacristy and see where the white cabinet is located. Also, Greece Volunteer Ambulance offers first aid and CPR courses on a regular basis. If you are interested in learning more call GVA and they will give you the details. We pray that we will never need to use any of our first aid supplies and equipment, but it's reassuring to know we're prepared if anything should happen.

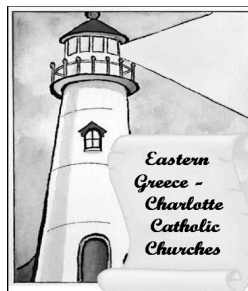
